- **Position Description:** The position of Treasurer shall be a voting member of the Board of Directors to ensure the complete and accurate financial accounting of the association. The Treasurer shall oversee the financial affairs of the Corporation and shall fulfill other duties incident to the office of the Treasurer. Shall be bonded at the expense of the Corporation.

## **Position: Government Affairs Co-Chair**

- **Qualifications:** Shall be an occupational therapy practitioner licensed in the State of Connecticut and in good standing with ConnOTA.
- **Position Description:** The position of Member for Government Affairs is a voting member of the Board of Directors to work with the association lobbyists to monitor and respond to legislative activities on a state and federal level and recommend a course of action to the board based upon the current environment.
